

WELCOME



On behalf of the state Emergency Support Function 17 and the Florida Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services, we welcome you to the 2023 Florida State Agricultural Response Team Planning Workshop. We are very excited to have you all here with us in sunny Daytona Beach, Florida! We are looking forward to spending the next couple days taking a closer look at disaster preparedness for animals and agriculture. This Workshop will touch on many different aspects of animal and agricultural-related emergency situations, and we will learn more about the important

role that our SART partners play in disaster response.

Since our last planning meeting, four years ago, much has happened between a worldwide pandemic to a major hurricane like Ian along with the presence of Highly Pathogenic Avian Influenza, all of which created a need for a significant animal and agricultural response from our state. Hurricane Ian alone caused an estimated \$1.8 billion total losses to Florida's agriculture production and infrastructure, over \$113 billion in damage, making it the third costliest hurricane to hit Florida on record. With 149 fatalities in Florida, and a total of 160 fatalities throughout Cuba, Florida, North Carolina, and Virginia, Hurricane Ian became the second deadliest storm on record in the United States, only behind Hurricane Katrina in 2005. While many things have changed, the threat of disaster to Florida's agriculture remains, and we hope to create a planning workshop that encourages all of Florida's responders to be more prepared.

These events emphasized the importance of working together as a SART partnership to create a coordinated and efficient response. Florida SART is made up of non-governmental organizations, local, state, and federal government agencies. By having this wide variety of experiences and resources, Florida SART is able to manage a disaster response with its tools, resources, and expertise that protect our animal and agricultural communities. As they say, "Teamwork makes the dream work!"

During this workshop, we ask each one of you to build relationships with our FL SART leaders and experts in the field from across the state, as well as gain knowledge and training to take back to your county, and learn more about how to find specialized resources to help your residents before, during, and after a disaster. We hope you enjoy the workshop!




